TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ADMISSION

- The fundamental prerequisite** of being accepted to the undergraduate study program (first degree) is full completion of secondary education (Higher Education Act, n.131/2002 Coll.).
- Language competence** – written and oral command of Slovak or Czech. Studying at the faculty, including the opportunity of spending a part of your study abroad, calls for a need of mastering at least one of the world languages minimally in the scope of the high school curriculum (English, German, Spanish, French, Russian).
- Health certificates** – the faculty does not require any health certificates and accepts all the applications without it.
- The faculty retains the right not to open the study program when the **number of applicants** is less than 10.



FORMS OF ACCEPTANCE

- No entrance exams (written tests), the Faculty will accept the applicants who:**
 - in the past 2 years and in the final exams achieved the average marks up to 1,5,
 - in the current school year passed NPS (SCIO) tests of study skills and Maths and their score was 60 percent or higher;
 - succeeded (first 5 placements) in subject competitions accredited by the Ministry of Education , Science, Research and Sport of the Slovak Republic and UNIZA on national and international level.

For acceptance of an applicant without entrance exams, the applicant must meet at least one condition.

2. Entrance exams

All the other applicants who do not meet the conditions for being accepted without entrance exams will have to attend the selection procedure (written tests).

Rules of Selection Procedure

The applicants who do not meet the terms and conditions of acceptance without entrance exams, will have to take written general knowledge tests. These tests focus on general academic competence that students need to successfully complete their degrees. The tests include a quantitative part, verbal part and a general knowledge test. Applicants will be accepted on the basis of these test results according to the order of points achieved, depending on the planned capacity. The final decision about the results of entrance exams is made by the dean of FBI UNIZA based on the recommendation of the selection committee of the faculty. The dean is authorized to move the applicants from one study programme to another in case they were not accepted for the chosen study programme due to the full capacity. In chosen bachelor's degree study programs, in case of vacant places, there is a possibility of organizing a second round of entrance exams. The list of the bachelor's degree study programmes for the second round of entrance exams, deadline for applying and the date of entrance exams will be announced by 19.6.2017. The terms of acceptance and the form of acceptance for the bachelor's degree study programs are the same as in the first round.



ADMISSION OF FOREIGN STUDENTS

The same terms and conditions of admission are applicable as for the applicants from abroad as for the applicants from Slovakia.

Foreign students who study in a foreign language (i.e. not Slovak), pay the tuition fee as stated in § 92 Subsection 8 (Higher Education Act). The tuition fee is specified by the UNIZA directive for the respective academic year, which can be found on the university website. Students from abroad who study in Slovak language do not have to pay the tuition fee. The applicants from the Czech republic who want to apply and study in Žilina can use the application form available in the Czech republic. The applicants who do not actively speak Slovak or Czech are required to attend the language training. (It is possible to attend the Slovak for Foreigners courses at UNIZA). For foreign applicants who were accepted on the basis of international agreements or Slovak government grants, terms and conditions stated in respective agreements are applicable.



HOW TO APPLY

To apply for any of the bachelor's degree programs at FBI UNIZA, one application form where the applicant states the study programmes in order of their preference is satisfactory. In case the applicant is interested in both forms of study (full time and part time), it is necessary to apply for both of them (two application forms are required), including the two admission procedure fees.

Applicants have to fill in the form *Prihláška na vysokoškolské štúdium - 1. Stupeň* or they can also use an electronic application form that can be found on the university website: <https://vzdelavanie.uniza.sk/prijimacky/index.php> or on the education portal: <https://prihlaskavs.sk/sk/>. Even in case of electronic application form, it is required to print it, sign it, enclose other required documents including the proof of payment of the fee and send it to the address FBI UNIZA, Ul. 1. mája 32, 010 26 Žilina within the stipulated deadlines. Incomplete study application or application sent after the deadline will not be accepted. In the absence of or failure of entrance exams, the faculty does not refund the admission fee. If an applicant wants to take part in entrance exams

at more faculties of UNIZA, the application forms have to be sent separately to each faculty and the respective admission procedure fees paid separately to each faculty.

Enclosures for the bachelor's degree programmes (to be sent with application forms):

1. Curriculum Vitae,
2. proof of payment of the admission fee,
3. copies of annual secondary school certificates.

After passing the final secondary school exams, the applicants will send the copy of the final exam certificate as well as the copy of the last annual secondary school certificate. The deadline for sending these documents will be announced to all applicants individually by mail.

BACHELOR STUDY PROGRAMMES

SECURITY MANAGEMENT

(Field of study 8.3.1 Protection of Persons and Property)

The study programme prepares experts in the field of people and property protection with specific focus on security risks. They are able to design and operate integrated electronic security systems. The graduates received instruction in economics and related technical and social sciences and are able to apply this knowledge in the field of security management.

SECURITY AND PROTECTION OF CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE

(Field of study 8.3.7 Civil Security)

The study programme prepares experts in the field of security and protection of critical infrastructure, with specific focus on energetics, transport and essential fundamentals in the field of information and communication technologies. The graduates are able to design and implement preventive actions, monitor and analyze development of risk-bearing and crisis factors and to prepare an adequate response to the crisis phenomena. They can also manage continuity of operation of critical infrastructure and effectively renew systems in the ex post phase.

CRISIS MANAGEMENT

(Field of study 8.3.7 Civil Security)

The study programme prepares experts in the field of crisis management for public administration and business companies. They are able to assess possible risks, monitor them, prepare emergency planning, and manage crises.

The graduates received instruction in economics and related technical and social sciences, They are employable in national and civil defence, public order protection and other fields.

RESCUE SERVICES

(Field of study 8.3.6 Rescue Services)

The study programme prepares experts able to perform preventive, administrative, rescue and relief activities in the field of fire prevention measures and state fire supervision. They are employable in state administration, manufacturing and business companies as well as in fire and rescue units.
