TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ADMISSION

1. **The fundamental prerequisite** of being accepted to the postgraduate study program (third degree) is full completion of the second degree of the university study (Higher Education Act, n. 131/2002 Coll.).
2. **Health certificate** – the faculty does not require any health certificates and accepts all the applications without health certificates for the doctoral degree of the university studies.



FORMS OF ADMISSION

Selection Procedure

- Admission procedure is carried out in a form of a selection procedure in order to ensure that the admitted candidates dispose of the necessary skills and abilities.

Rules of Selection Procedure

- The applicant applies for a specific dissertation topic. Dissertation topics along with a notice of admission procedure for the doctoral study will be published on the official notice board of the Faculty and the website www.fhv.uniza.sk at least two months before the application deadline.
- Evaluation of the admission procedure and the proposal of candidates for admission for the doctoral studies in the relevant study programme are accomplished by the selection committee appointed by the Dean of the Faculty.
- The Dean makes the decision on the applicant's admission within 30 days from the date of the entrance examination.
- Only those candidates who successfully pass the entrance examination can be admitted.

Mediamatics and Cultural Heritage - (full-time, part-time study)

The general content of the entrance examination:

- Presentation of own project of the chosen dissertation topic.
- Oral examination at which the candidates have to demonstrate their prerequisites for independent scientific research activities and a good orientation in the chosen field of study.

Selection of candidates is based on the order drawn up on the basis of:

- a) the results of the entrance examination (max. 40 points, selection committee decides on the amount of points assigned),
- b) the results of the previous study (max. 30 points, allocated according to the WGA (weighted grade average) of the second degree of university study according to the following schedule: WGA 1 to 1.25 = 30 points; WGA 1.26 to 1.99 = 20 points; WGA 2 and more = 0 points)
- c) academic papers published so far and scientific activities performed (max. 30 points, the amount of points assigned is decided by the selection committee).



ACCEPTANCE OF FOREIGN STUDENTS

The same terms and conditions of admission are applicable as for the applicants from abroad as for the applicants from Slovakia.

Foreign students who study in a foreign language (i.e. not Slovak), pay the tuition fee as stated in § 92 Subsection 8 (Higher Education Act). The tuition fee is specified by the UNIZA directive for the respective academic year, which can be found on the university website.

Students from abroad who study in the Slovak language do not have to pay the tuition fee. The applicants from the Czech Republic who want to apply and study in Žilina can use the application form available in the Czech Republic. The applicants who do not actively speak Slovak or Czech are required to attend the language training. (It is possible to attend the Slovak for Foreigners courses at UNIZA).

For foreign applicants who were accepted on the basis of international agreements or Slovak government grants, terms and conditions stated in respective agreements are applicable.



HOW TO APPLY

Application forms are to be submitted for individual study programmes.

In case the applicant is interested in more study programmes, it is necessary to apply for each one individually, including payment of the respective admission procedure fees.

Applicants have to fill in the form Prihláška na vysokoškolské štúdium - 3. stupeň or they can also use an electronic application form that can be found on the university website: <https://vzdelanie.uniza.sk/prijimacky/index.php> or on the education portal: <https://prihlaskavs.sk/sk/>.

Even in case of electronic application form, it is required to print it, sign it, enclose other required documents including the proof of payment of the fee and send it to the address of the Faculty of Humanities UNIZA within the stipulated deadlines.

Incomplete study application or application sent after the deadline will not be accepted.

In the absence of or failure of entrance exams, the faculty does not refund the admission fee.

If an applicant wants to take part in entrance exams at more faculties of UNIZA, the application forms have to be sent separately to each faculty and the respective admission procedure fees paid separately to each faculty.

Enclosures for the doctoral degree programmes (to be sent with application forms):

1. Curriculum Vitae,
2. certified copies of the highest level of education (except the graduates from Faculty of Humanities/ former Faculty of Science UNIZA),
3. a list of published academic and scientific papers and a list of other profession activities in the field of library and information science,
4. general project framework of the chosen dissertation topic,
5. proof of payment of the admission fee.
