## TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ADMISSION

The fundamental prerequisite of being accepted to the bachelor's degree study programme (first degree) is the full completion of secondary education or full secondary vocational education (Higher Education Act, n.131/2002 Coll.). In the case of a foreign applicant or student who has completed a secondary education abroad, the education is comparable with an education completed by a school leaving examination in the Slovak Republic. Applicant who has obtained a secondary education abroad will submit along with the application form or more precisely no later than the date of enrolment a document on completion of secondary education recognized by a relevant institution in the Slovak Republic.

### Procedure for recognition of document on education

On the basis of submitted application, the document is recognised by a district office in the Slovak Republic after comparing the scope and content of education received with the scope and content of education required by the National Education Programme in the Slovak Republic.

In the case of recognition of document on education of a minor, the application shall be submitted by his/her legal representative. The application form for the recognition of document can be found on the UNIZA website (English version) in the STUDY section.

List of enclosures to be submitted along with the application form:

- a) the authenticity of signatures and of the school's stamp mark on the document on completion of education must be certified by a relevant body (applicants for study abroad should arrange this immediately after receiving the document before traveling to the Slovak Republic),
- b) a certified copy of the document on completion of education,
- c) a certified translation of the document into the official language of the Slovak Republic,
- d) a list of subjects and examinations completed,
- e) a certified translation of the list into the official language of the Slovak Republic,
- f) a copy of proof of identity,
- g) a proof of payment of administration fee.

**Language competence** – for study programmes that are carried out by the faculty in the Slovak language, written and oral command of Slovak or Czech language is required. Knowledge of at least one foreign language (English, German, French) is welcome. For study programmes that are carried out by the faculty in the English language, written and oral command of English is required. The applicants who do not actively speak Slovak or Czech are required to attend the language training. It is possible to attend the Slovak language courses at UNIZA. - The faculty retains the right not to open the study programme when the number of applicants is less than 10.
- The basic and other terms and conditions of admission are applicable as for the applicants from abroad as for the applicants from Slovakia.
- Foreign students who study in a foreign language (i.e. not Slovak), pay the tuition fee as stated in § 92 Subsection 8 (Higher Education Act). The tuition fee is specified by the UNIZA directive for the respective academic year, which can be found on the university website. For the academic year 2019/20 the tuition fee is 3500 €.
- Students from abroad who study in the Slovak language do not have to pay the tuition fee.
- The applicants from the Czech Republic who want to apply and study in Žilina can use the application form available in the Czech Republic. The applicants who do not actively speak Slovak or Czech are required to attend the language training. (It is possible to attend the Slovak language courses at UNIZA).
- For foreign applicants who were accepted on the basis of intergovernmental agreements, bilateral agreements or Slovak government grants, terms and conditions stated in respective documents are applicable.



# 1. No entrance exams (without passing written tests), the Faculty will accept the applicants who meet the following criteria:

- a) the secondary grammar school leavers who achieved the average marks up to 1,7 (inclusive) in the past 2 years and in the school leaving examination;
- b) the leavers from other secondary schools who achieved the average marks up to 1,5 (inclusive) in the past 2 years and in the school leaving examination;
- c) in the current school year passed NPS (SCIO) tests of study skills and Maths and their score was 60 percent or higher;
- d) succeeded (first 5 placements) in subject competitions accredited by the Ministry of Education, Science, Research and Sport of the Slovak Republic and UNIZA on national and international level.

For acceptance of an applicant without entrance exams, the applicant must meet at least one condition mentioned above.

### 2. Entrance exams

All the other applicants who do not meet the conditions for being accepted without entrance exams will have to attend the selection procedure (written tests).

### **Rules of selection procedure**

The applicants who do not meet the terms and conditions of admission without entrance exams, will have to take written general knowledge tests. These tests focus on general academic competence that students need to successfully complete their degrees. The test contains a **quantitative part** (simple mathematical tasks, analytical and logical thinking, deduction, drawing conclusion, **a verbal part** (ability to analyse the linguistic means of the Slovak language in terms of their grammatical, lexical and stylistic characteristics, meaning and form in vocabulary) and **a general knowledge overview** (orientation in current domestic and foreign events).

Applicants will be accepted on the basis of the results of entrance exams according to the order of points achieved, depending on the planned capacity. The final decision about the results of entrance exams is made by the dean of FBI UNIZA based on the recommendation of the selection committee of the faculty. The Dean is authorised to supplement the state of accepted applicants of the first year of bachelor's degree study programmes to the expected number of applicants who have met conditions for being accepted for a different bachelor's degree study programme but were not accepted due to the full capacity of previously chosen study programme.

In chosen bachelor's degree study programmes, in case of vacant places, there is a possibility of organizing a second round of entrance exams. The list of the bachelor's degree study programmes for the second round of entrance exams, deadline for applying and the date of entrance exams will be announced by 21.6.2019. The terms of admission and the form of admission for the bachelor's degree study programmes are the same as in the first round.



### **HOW TO APPLY**

To apply for any of the bachelor's degree programmes at FBI UNIZA, one application form where the applicant states the study programmes in order of their preference is satisfactory. In case the applicant is interested in both forms of study (full time and part time), it is necessary to apply for both of them (two application forms are required), including the two admission procedure fees.

Applicants have to fill in the form Prihláška na vysokoškolské štúdium – 1. Stupeň or they can also use an electronic application form that can be found on the university website: https://vzdelavanie.uniza.sk/prijimacky/index.php or on the education portal: https://prihlaskavs.sk/sk/.

Even in case of electronic application form, it is required to print it, sign it, enclose other required documents including the proof of payment of the fee and send it to the address FBI UNIZA, Ul. 1. mája 32, 010 26 Žilina within the stipulated deadlines. Incomplete study application or application sent after the deadline will not be accepted.

In the absence of or a failure of entrance exams, the faculty does not refund the admission fee.

If an applicant wants to take part in entrance exams at more faculties of UNIZA, the application forms have to be sent separately to each faculty and the respective admission procedure fees paid separately to each faculty.

### Enclosures for the bachelor's degree study programmes (to be sent with application forms):

- 1. Curriculum Vitae,
- 2. proof of payment of the admission fee,
- 3. copies of annual secondary school certificates.

After passing the school leaving examination, the applicants will send the copy of the school leaving examination certificate

as well as the copy of the last annual secondary school certificate. The deadline for sending these documents will be announced to all applicants individually by mail.

### **BACHELOR'S STUDY PROGRAMMES**

### **SECURITY MANAGEMENT**

### (Field of study 8.3.1 Protection of Persons and Property)

The study is aimed at the university education of professionals providing security services for the tangible or intangible assets of citizens, individuals, legal entities, municipalities and the state from the effects of security risks as well as capable of designing and operating integrated electronic security systems for protection of objects. The graduate has acquired knowledge in relevant technical, economic and social sciences and the ability to apply them to the terms of security management.

# SECURITY AND PROTECTION OF CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE (Field of study 8.3.7 Civil Security)

The study programme prepares experts in the field of security and protection of critical infrastructure, with specific focus on energetics, transport and essential fundamentals in the field of information and communication technologies. The graduates are able to design and implement preventive actions, monitor and analyse development of riskbearing and crisis factors and to prepare an adequate response to the crisis phenomena. The can also manage continuity of operation of critical infrastructure and effectively renew systems in the ex post phase.

### **CRISIS MANAGEMENT**

### (Field of study 8.3.7 Civil Security)


The study is aimed at the university education of professionals who can serve in the public sector, enterprises and firms dealing with analysis of the risks and potential crisis situations and their monitoring. They are also able to prepare the documents concerning emergency planning, crisis plans and managing crises. Graduates have a degree in relevant economic, technical and social sciences including their applications. They can serve in functions in the areas of state defence, civil protection of the population, protection of public order and others.

### **RESCUE SERVICES**

### (Field of study 8.3.6 Rescue Services)

The study is focused on the university education of professionals who are able to perform preventive, administrative, rescue and relief activities in the field of fire protection in the structures of state administration, production and economic organizations, fire and rescue units. They can perform specialized work activities in the performance of state fire protection, functions in fire-fighting units, fire protection specialists in industrial and economic sectors of the Slovak Republic.
