TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ADMISSION

Basic condition of admission

The basic condition for admission to doctoral degree study (the third degree study programme) is the full completion of the second degree of university education (Higher Education Act, no. 131/2002 Coll. As amended) in the same field of study or in a study programme whose content is related to the study programme Mediamatics and Cultural Heritage. In case of a foreign applicant or a student who has completed his / her study abroad, he / she shall submit along with the application form (no later than on the date of enrolment) a decision on the recognition of the certificate of completion of the second degree of higher education recognized by a relevant institution in the Slovak Republic.

Other conditions of admission

Selection procedure

Admission procedure is carried out in the form of a selection procedure in order to ensure that the admitted applicants dispose of the necessary skills and prerequisites.

Rules of selection procedure:

- the applicant applies for a specific topic of the dissertation thesis. The topics of dissertation theses will be published together with the announcement of the admission procedure for doctoral study on the official notice board of the Faculty and at www.fhv.uniza.sk at least 2 months before the deadline for submitting the application forms,
- the evaluation of the admission procedure and the proposal of the applicants for admission to the doctoral degree study in the relevant study programme will be carried out by the admission committee appointed by the Dean of the Faculty,
- the Dean of the Faculty makes the decision on the admission of the applicant within 30 days from the date of the entrance examination,
- only those applicants who have successfully passed the entrance examination can be admitted to study.

General content of the entrance examination:

- presentation of own project on the chosen topic of the dissertation thesis,
- professional discussion in which the applicant must demonstrate the prerequisites for independent scientific and research activities and good orientation in the chosen field of study.

Selection of the applicants is based on the ranking based on:

- a) the results of the entrance examination (max. 40 points, the admission committee will decide on the amount of points assigned,
- b) the results of previous study (max. 30 points, allocated according to the WSA (weighted study average)) of the second degree of university study according to the following schedule: WSA 1-1.25=30 points, WSA 1.26-1.99=20 points; WSA 2 and more = 0 points),
- c) publishing and scientific activities (max. 30 points, the admission committee will decide on the amount of points assigned).



The basic and other terms and conditions of admission are applicable as for the applicants from abroad as for the applicants from Slovakia.

Foreign students who study in the Slovak language do not have to pay the tuition fee. Applicants from the Czech Republic can use the form valid in the Czech Republic to submit their application for study. For foreign applicants who were admitted on the basis of intergovernmental agreements, bilateral agreements or Slovak government grants, terms and conditions stated in respective documents are applicable.



Application forms are to be submitted for individual study programmes.

Applicants fill in the application form - Prihláška na vysokoškolské štúdium - 3. Stupeň or they can also use an electronic application form. The electronic application can be filled in via the UNIZA website: https://vzdelavanie.uniza.sk/prijimacky/index.php or on the Portal VS (University Portal): https://prihlaskavs.sk/sk/.

Even in the case of an electronic application form, it is required to print it, sign it, enclose other required documents including the proof of payment of the fee and send it by post to the address of the Faculty of Humanities UNIZA within the stipulated deadlines.

Incomplete application form or application form sent after the deadline will not be accepted.

In case of non-participation in the admission procedure or a failure in the admission procedure, the Faculty does not refund the admission procedure fee. If the applicant wants to take part in the admission procedure at several faculties of UNIZA, the application forms must be submitted separately to each faculty with the payment of the relevant fee.

- 2. certified copies of the documents on education completed (except the graduates from the Faculty of Humanities/ former Faculty of Natural Sciences UNIZA),

- 4. elaborated framework project on the chosen topic,
- 5. proof of payment of the admission fee.

MEDIAMATICS AND CULTURAL HERITAGE
(Field of study 7205 Media and Communication Studies)

Graduates have a highly developed abstract component of thinking on the basis of perfect mastery of the basic disciplines of library and information science, scientific methods of research and a deep theoretical knowledge of some of the areas of mediamatics and cultural heritage. They are able to work creatively in the field of mediamatics and cultural heritage and apply the obtained results in other disciplines. Graduates can work in research in the field of library and information science and in the field of media as experts in memory and cultural institutions, as university teachers, etc. Depending on the narrower specialization of their study and the topic of the dissertation thesis, they can do business in the field of mass media, provide information services for state administration, the third sector or work as specialists for the creation and analysis of information content.
